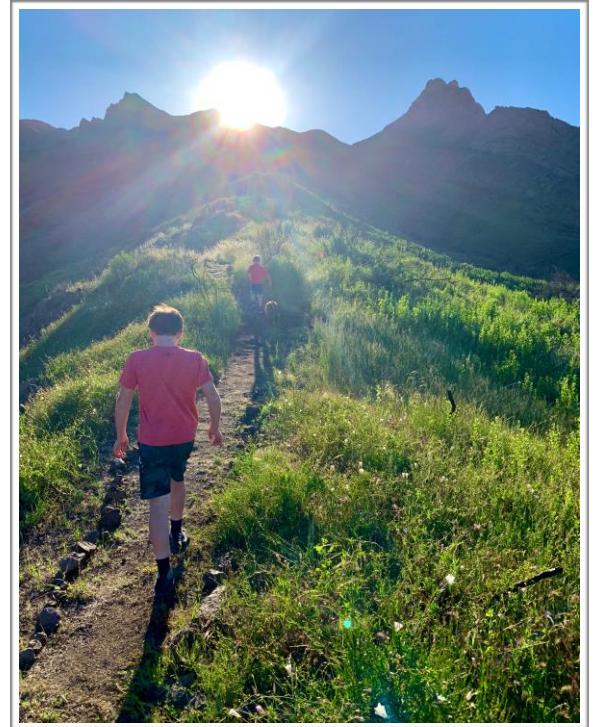


Covid guidelines for ALL campers/guests

(Current state overnight camp guidelines may be updated and adjust)

Before Arrival

- Fill out the health screening form within 48 hours of attending camp.
- We **recommend** that your group provide proof, of a negative Covid test, that has been conducted within 72 hours before arrival.
 - If vaccinated, no negative test is required, however we **recommend** that you show proof of vaccination.
- We request that all unvaccinated guests quarantine as much as possible before arriving at camp.
- If you have any covid symptoms, tested Covid positive within the past 10 days, have a fever, or if you have been exposed to a Covid-19 case – please do not attend camp.
- **We ask** that group leaders set up stable/cohort/family groups that will remain together for the entire camp session without mixing with other campers/guests/stable groups in close contact circumstances.
- Bring enough masks to get you through your stay at camp
- If you have traveled out-of-country, in the previous 10 days, (from when your camp date starts) you may not attend camp (unless can show proof of vaccination).



During Camp Session

- **Masks**
 - Indoors – required for ALL guests (unless eating)
 - Outdoors – not required
- Upon arrival, you will be screened by answering health questions. Temperature checks are **recommended**.
- Daily symptom checks are required during your stay
- If symptoms occur during the check-in at camp or if you don't pass the daily health screening, you will need to vacate the camp premises.
- Wash hands/sanitize often.

What Camp Will Do

- Increased hand sanitizing stations throughout camp. Stations in all meeting spaces and dining locations.
- **Daily** disinfect surfaces and objects that are touched frequently and in common areas.
- Post signage to promote good hygiene and proper hand washing throughout camp.
- Provide an isolation location for any guest that is showing symptoms until transportation is available.
- Promote social distancing by:
 - Reducing chairs per table in the dining hall.
 - Reduce lodging capacities.
 - Appropriately space chairs in meeting rooms.
- Food Service staff will serve food according to local health recommendations
- Ensure camp staff: Stay home or are sent home if displaying symptoms.
